The conversation was circling around the question of exactly when was Easter? The bagger (who I judged to be in his early 20's) guessed that it must be the coming Saturday. I let him know that no, it was the coming Sunday. Easter is ALWAYS on Sunday. And then I left the store a little bit more than slightly shocked.

This person clearly seemed to have little or no concept of Easter beyond spring flowers, Easter bunnies, chicks, and eggs. He seemed to have no idea it is in any way affiliated with the church. And why should he? If one grows up in the secular world, Easter bunnies and eggs are the only things one sees. This is one religious holiday that has been almost completely co-opted by the commercial market.

Friends, we often think of the mission world as being somewhere else, but it is right outside our doors! What we take for common knowledge ISN'T!!! We live and work with people who have little or no idea of what Christianity is. As uncomfortable as it may feel, we need to seek the Holy Spirit and ask for help to open our mouths and share the Good News with everyone we meet – and not take it for granted that they already know.

Session 4- Jesus Heals 10 Lepers (Luke 17:11-19)


