Adult Legislative Seminar Washington, DC April 25 to May 1, 2020

Have you ever been in your Senator's or Representative's DC office? Have you spoken directly with either your elected official or their chief of staff on an issue that is important to you? Well, here is a chance to do all these things and much, much more by participating in the "Adult Legislative Seminar" led by Cassandra Dahnke and Tomas Spath, co-founders of the "Institute for Civility in Government".

Prior to departing for DC, the group will decide on up to three issues to be discussed with elected officials. Once in DC and guided by these issues you will attend informative seminars led by experts in these areas. Based on this information, presentations will be developed and shared with your elected officials when you meet with them in their office. This experience will give you a deeper understanding of who these officials are, a glimpse of what their day is like, and an

appreciation for how they get things done.

But the Adult Legislative Seminars allow for much more. Whether you have ever been to DC or not, there is always much to see and do, all of which provides for a deeper understanding of our nation's capital and our history. Of course there are monuments and memorials. There are museums galore, including the Holocaust, the Newseum, and the new African American Museum of History and Culture. There is culture to be found at the Kennedy Center, and meals to be shared at a wide array of restaurants. There are opportunities for worship at historical churches, including New York Avenue Presbyterian Church (where Lincoln attended) and Old Presbyterian Meeting House, whose history dates back to the colonial period. Sightseeing is on your own, but there is plenty of help and guidance along the way.
