Words from Cassandra:

If the timing of this newsletter seems a little odd, blame it on me. It is too late for February, and too early for March. But the truth is I have had a very hard time sitting down to write this.

As many of you know, I announced my upcoming retirement at our Annual Congregational meeting in January. May 31st will be my last day with Woodforest. Fittingly enough, it will be Pentecost and a celebration of the Holy Spirit! I cannot think of a better time for change!

This has been a tremendously difficult decision for me to make. I've always said that deciding to go to seminary was the hardest decision I had ever made. The decision to leave you now has been every bit as difficult.

This is particularly true because Presbyterian polity prevents any ongoing relationship with you that even hints at the pastoral. I will NOT be available to do weddings, baptisms, or funerals. I will not be returning to preach or to participate in worship services. I will not be able to counsel you. For all of these things, you will need to look to your new pastoral leadership.

Facebook? The Institute? If you reach out to me through these things, we can maintain some contact, as long as it does not interfere in any way with the ministry of the church or your new pastoral leaders.

Why am I leaving? It's time. I am no longer doing the quality of work I expect of myself at Woodforest (if indeed I ever have). It is time for the church to have new leadership – leadership that is younger and more energetic, with some of the skills I simply do not possess.

Am I leaving to go to another church? No! There is no way I would want to replace you. But I feel a strong call to other things. It is way past time for the Institute for Civility in Government to get my fuller attention, and I have other ministries I want to participate in as well

I am working with the church session to insure as smooth a transition as possible. I encourage all of you to maintain and/or even increase your commitment to and involvement with the church during this time of transition. Your Session members are great, but they cannot do this on their own. It will take ALL of you!

The good news is that this can be an exciting time in the life of Woodforest, and a time to grow in your faith journey. Look for opportunities to serve and remember – the Spirit is with you still!
